Do not use phone at least one hour before sleep. It helps us relax and gives us time to prepare for the next day.



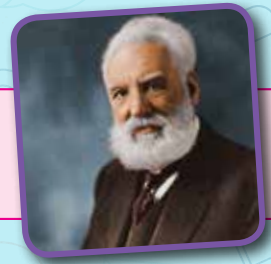
Sharing personal information with unknown people is a big 'NO'.
