






DAY OF THE DEAD - MEXICO


BORYEONG MUD FESTIVAL – SOUTH KOREA





Heavenly Bodies

The sun, moon, stars, planets and other objects in the sky are called heavenly bodies. These heavenly bodies constantly keep moving in our universe.

It is the brightest star in our galaxy. All the planets revolve around this shining yellow star. It is spherical in shape with a very hot core.

It is the only planet in the solar system which contains water and oxygen. It is also the only planet in the solar system to support life. It takes around 24 hours to rotate on its own axis which causes day and night.





It is the second largest planet in the solar system. It has well established rings all around it which distinguish it from all the other planets. It also has the largest number of natural satellites.

This is one of the most popular comets in the world. This comet occurs every 76 years. It is named after Edmund Halley, the astronomer who discovered that this comet appears after every 75 or 76 years.





It is Earth's natural satellite. It is approximately onefourth size of Earth. It reflects light from the sun to shine. It contains a large number of craters all over it. Its gravitation force is 1/6th of Earth.

This natural phenomenon happens when the sun, moon and the earth happen to fall in a straight line. It only occurs on a new moon day. The shadow of the moon is reflected on the sun and it appears as if the sun is hidden behind the moon.





It happens when a large number of meteors enter the atmosphere and start to burn up. They appear as if it is showering fire. Most meteor showers are caused by the debris from comets.

This is the largest planet of our solar system. It is 70% of volume of the other planets put together. It is also known for its famous huge red spot. It is the only planet with its own internal source of energy.

Nobel Prize Laureates

The Nobel Prizes were established by Alfred Nobel in his will in the year 1895. This is a set of highly prestigious annual international awards awarded mainly in the categories—Chemistry, Physics, Peace, Literature and Medicine. These are awarded by the Swedish and Norwegian institutions in recognition of academic, cultural and scientific advances in the world. 
National Parks of India

A national park is a place used for conservation purposes. It is a place mainly used for the conservation of different animal and plant species.


Let's name the states where these national parks are situated.



Dachigam National Park: This national park is the only area where the Kashmir stag or the Hangul is found. The name of the park means "ten villages" which could be in memory of the ten villages that were relocated for its formation.



Gir National Park: This national park is also popularly known as 'Sasan Gir'. It was established to protect the Asiatic lions and is the most important protected natural areas in Asia due to the rare animals living here such as lions, vultures, pythons, crocodiles, etc.



Kaziranga National Park: This park is home to the Indian rhinoceros and has been declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. It holds two-thirds of the world's population of the great one-horned rhinoceros.



Jim Corbett National Park: This is the oldest national park in India established in the year 1936. It was originally named Hailey National Park. Its name was later renamed after the well-known author, naturalist and hunter — Jim Corbett.




Great Himalayan National Park: It is situated in the lap of the Himalayas and is home to numerous species of flora, fauna and animals. In 2014, it was added to the list of UNESCO World Heritage sites for the conservation of animals such as the red panda, snow leopard, etc.



Desert National Park: This is one of the few national parks located in a desert area. Thousands of migratory birds make this park their home every year. It is an excellent example of the ecosystem of the Thar Desert.



Bandipur National Park: This National Park has the second highest tiger population in India and is one of the premier tiger reserves in the country. It is also home to numerous other animals and birds such as leopards, sambar deer, chital, gray langurs, etc.



Kanha National Park: This National Park is located near the city of Mandla. This huge park has a significant population of the Royal Bengal Tigers, Indian leopards, sloth bear, barasingha and Indian wild dog.

The Magic of Yoga

Yoga brings together physical and mental disciplines to achieve peaceful body and mind. Children should learn yoga from a young age as it helps to keep the body and mind healthy.

Let us learn a few yoga asanas.



Anuloma-Viloma Or Alternate Nostril Breathing:

It is a breathing exercise that can be practised on everyday basis as it helps regulate the energy channels of our body. It is best practised before the asanas.

Steps to do Alternate Nostril Breathing:

- Sit in an upright position with folded legs in the Padmasana or Lotus Pose.
- Press your right nostril with the right thumb and breathe in slowly through the left nostril.
- Now, press the left nostril with the right forefinger and breathe out through the right nostril.
- Repeat it multiple times for best results.

Bhujangasana or the Cobra Pose:

It is a reclining back-bending asana in hatha yoga and modern yoga as an exercise.

Steps to do the Cobra Pose:

- Lie face down on your yoga mat.
- Put both your hands on the floor at shoulder level.
- Press onto the floor with both hands and slowly lift your upper body up.
- Pull your shoulders towards the back slowly.
- Slowly and steadily, pull your entire front body up like a cobra.
- Stay in this pose for some time while breathing in and out slowly.
- Hold the pose as long as possible, breathe out and return to the first position.



Dhanurasana or the Bow Pose:

It is a back-bending asana in hatha yoga and modern yoga as an exercise.

Steps to do the Bow Pose:

- Lie face down on your yoga mat.
- Put both your hands alongside your torso.
- Slowly while inhaling, lift your heels away from your buttocks.
- Also, at the same time lift your thighs away from the floor.
- Hold your ankles with your hands and keep yourself in the position for as long as possible.
- Slowly breathe out and return to the first position.



Savasana or the Corpse Pose:

It is an asana that is used for relaxation at the end of a yoga session. It is usually the pose in which one sleeps on the back.

Steps to do the Corpse Pose:

- Lie down on your back just like how you sleep.
- Put your arms at your side with the palms facing up.
- Close your eyes and relax your body.
- Breathe slowly and deeply through your nostrils.
- Start concentrating and empty your mind of all thoughts.
- Stay in this position for some time till your body is fully relaxed.

BENEFITS OF YOGA

- It helps to increase the flexibility of the body.
- It increases muscle strength and helps in toning the body.
- It improves respiration and energy.
- It also helps in the reduction of excess of weight.
- It helps to increase concentration and memory.


